Completion	The student completed 1 assignment. (Poor 10 pt.)	The student completed 2 assignments. (Fair 20 pts.)	The student completed all 3 required assignments. (Good 30 pts.)
Computations	Most answers are incorrect. (Poor 10 pts)	There were a few mathematical errors. (Fair 20 pts)	The student's answers were correct. (Good 30 pts)
Neatness	The student's writing is hard to read, and the project was not turned into the teacher in an organized manner. (Poor 1 pt.)	The student's writing is somewhat neat and organized. (Fair 3 pts.)	The student's assignments are very neat and organized. (Good 5 pts.)
Creativity	The student put little creative energy into project; no originality. (Poor 1 pt.)	The student had some creative touches, but overall little originality. (Fair 3 pts.)	The student put a great deal of creative energy into project; very original. (Good 5 pts.)
